

Projects Funded in November 2014

Neighborhood Connections, with additional funding from Cuyahoga Arts & Culture, will support \$150,000 in grants to 66 projects in Cleveland and East Cleveland. The following details each project, grant amount and neighborhood where the project will take place.

Projects marked with an asterisk and shaded will be co-funded in part by the residents of Cuyahoga County through

		Forest. This health program will provide organic produce from fruit trees grown on church
		property. In addition, community members will be educated on organic farming and health issues.

		bring neighbors together to improve neighborhood gardens.

		for those who cannot afford them.
